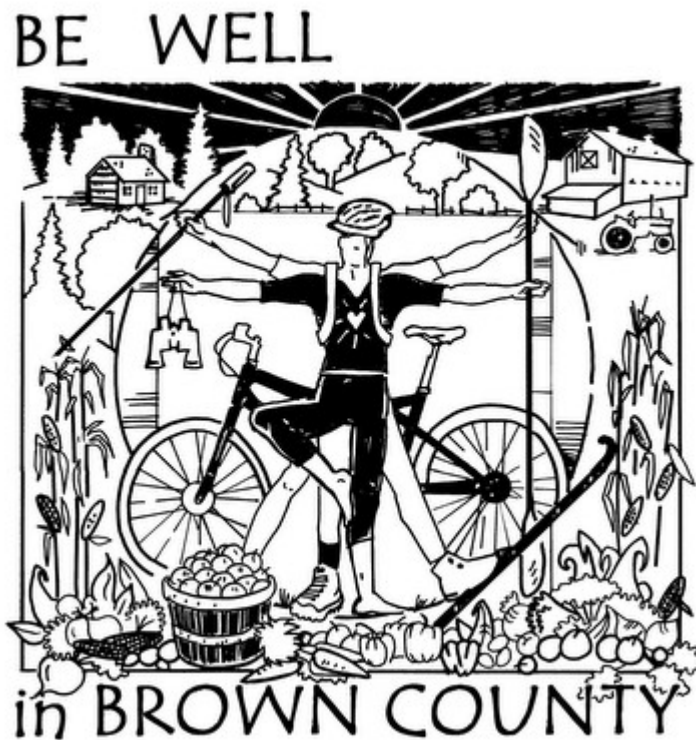

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NATURAL HERITAGE ASSETS

Brown County with Nashville and its surrounding communities is not like other lightly populated counties in Indiana. With just 15,000 residents (81st in the state) Brown County has a population density of just 48 people per square mile, compared with 182 statewide. However, Brown County has by far the highest concentration of forested land of any of Indiana's 92 counties with nearly 90% coverage and almost no large farms at all. The early settlers lived a rugged pioneer type of life for many years. Their cabins and small settlements were mere niches in the great forest that covered hills and valleys. Much of the county's 312 square miles are State and Federal lands or privately owned and not open to development.

HIKING AND BIKING

Hoosier National Forest (812) 275-5987

The Forest is over 200,000 acres in size and spans nine counties of south-central Indiana. The northern section of the forest reaches into Brown County and has hundreds of miles of trails. The Charles C. Deam Wilderness Area, located in the Hoosier National Forest, covers approximately 13,000 acres (53 km²).

Lilly-Dickey Woods

The 550-acre Lilly-Dickey Woods was donated to Indiana University in 1942 for botanical research and arts studies. While most of Brown County forests were cleared in the late 1800s the woods have not been cleared at least in the past 150 years and there may be sections that were never cleared. It serves as a reference point for other Midwestern forests and as a key site of the forest matrix developed by the Smithsonian Institution Global Earth Observatory. The woods are not open to the public.

Whip-poor-will Woods - The Nature Conservancy

Whip-poor-will Woods' beauty is characterized by its rolling hills, deep ravines, narrow ridges and the charming song of its namesake. Ecologically, this 858 Acres preserve is important because it provides a large, unbroken forests area that allows many species of birds, reptiles and mammals that require such a space, to thrive.

Hitz-Rhodehamel Woods - The Nature Conservancy

Hitz-Rhodehamel is a large, high quality forest spanning ridge tops, ravines and upland areas. Array of wildflowers dot the ravines in early spring. Freeman Ridge

Browning Mountain

Also referred to as Indiana's Stonehenge, Browning Mountain rises over the town of Elkinsville and is home to huge slabs of limestone rock arranged in a circle. Elkinsville

Stone Head Nature Preserve including the Zimmerman Wetland Bird Habitat

Owned by Mike Kelley, the Nature Preserve comprises nearly 20 acres. The Zimmerman Wetland Bird Habitat is home to over 156 different species of birds. It is named for famed Brown County Bird painter William (Bill) Zimmerman

Located in Brown County State Park, Strahl Lake is a seven acre lake and Ogle Lake is a seventeen acre lake.

Yellowwood Lake

Completed in 1939, Yellowwood Lake is 133 acres in size and is about 30 feet deep.

Bear Lake

About 5 acres in size, Bear Lake is in Yellowwood State Forest and is open to the public.

Crooked Creek Lake

A small lake about 16.5 acres in size, Crooked Creek Lake lies east of the TC Steele State park and is open to the public.

Cordry Lake and Sweetwater Lake

Located in the northeastern part of Brown County in the Cordry-Sweetwater Conservancy, use of the lakes is restricted to the property owners and residents of the district.

Salt Creek

A stream flowing through southern parts of Brown County, as well as Monroe County, Salt Creek flows into Lake Monroe. When the water is high enough it is used for kayaks and canoes.

Hoosier National Forest (812) 275-598

Brown County State Park (812) 988-6406

The 15,776 acres Brown County State Park offers 10 trails ranging from .75 mile to 3 miles in length and from easy to rugged in difficulty plus a short easy winding trail on flat terrain. Of these Strahl Lake, a seven acre lake and Ogle Lake, a seventeen acre lake, allows rowboats. They have great walking trails around them. T.C. Steele State Historical Site (812) 988-2785

The site comprises 211 acres with original buildings, partially restored gardens and five hiking trails, ranging from Easy to Moderately Difficult. Inspiration Ridge Trail IS .25 mile, Peckerwood Trail .75 mile, Trail of Silences .5 mile, Whippoorwill Haunt Trail .75 mile, Wildflower Trail .5 mile Maps are available at the site. Located just off State Road 46, near Belmont.

Hitz-Rhodehamel Woods - The Nature Conservancy

Hitz-Rhodehamel is a large, high quality forest spanning ridge tops, ravines and upland areas. The Hoosier Hikers Council collaborated with The Nature Conservancy to build a three-mile trail that loops around the 484-acre Nature Preserve. Located at Persimmon Ridge Road (this is a dead end road).

Laura Hare Nature Preserve - Sycamore Land Trust

A 600 Acre parcel at Downey Hill, between Valley Branch and Mt Liberty roads. Trails will be developed soon, but until then visitors are welcome to park at the pull-off on Valley Branch Rd. and walk the old county roads. Drive East from Nashville, turn right on Valley Branch Rd. and drive 1.5 miles to pull off on left.

Trevlac Bluffs Nature Preserve - Sycamore Land Trust

Named for the towering 200 foot hemlock bluff over Beanblossom Creek a new acquisition is 27 acres - in common with Nature Conservancy and Indiana Heritage Trust will protect over 100 acres of forested wetlands.

Tecumseh Trail

The Tecumseh Trail begins at Morgan-Monroe State Forest Headquarters, about 5 miles south of Martinsville, and ends in a remote area of Brown County forest near Monroe Reservoir, just south of S.R. 46 near Crooked Creek Road. The 42-mile Tecumseh Trail skirts Bear Lake and was built by the Hoosier Hikers Council in 1998-2002. The HHC created and published a Tecumseh Trail map with detailed topographical information. The map can be purchased or downloaded and provides information useful in planning a hike or backpacking trip, such as parking, access, water, and camping. See:

HISTORIC HERITAGE ASSETS

The territory which makes up Brown County was obtained from the Indians in two treaties. The treaty of Fort Wayne in 1809, referred to as "Harrison's Purchase", and the treaty of St. Mary's in 1818, which added the land southwest of the famous "Ten O'clock Line." The first white man known to arrive was a German, Johann Schoonover. In that same year William Elkins, the first pioneer, built a log cabin and cleared land in what became Johnson Township. The earliest pioneers traveled on narrow Indian trails through dense hardwood forest with wagons drawn by oxen, by 1830 an estimated 150 settlers had arrived. There were people living in remote areas whose only contact with the outside world was the huckster's weekly visit with his horse and wagon. As a result the pioneer way of life continued long after other counties had adopted a new pattern of living.

In 1835 settlers presented a petition to the Legislature requesting a new county and in 1836 the land was divided into five townships. Nashville, then known as Jacksonburg, was chosen as the county seat. In 1837 a log court house was built, and the first log jail. They were built on the same lots on which the present court house and log jail stand. Nashville, at that time, consisted of a cluster of log cabins and 75 people. By the time Nashville was incorporated in 1872, water powered grist mills and sawmills were scattered over the county. Each village served its own locality with at least one general store, a blacksmith shop, a church and a post office. A doctor, sometimes more than one, lived in almost every village. In 1881 there were 20 doctors in the county, and 37 churches.

In 1905 there was a Railroad Station in Helmsburg with service to Indianapolis and Effingham, Illinois. In 1907, artist T. C. Steele built a studio near Belmont in rural Brown County and Adolph Shulz came to Nashville and thus began the Brown County Art Colony. Will Vawter, V.J. Cariani, Marie Goth, C. Curry Bohn, Dale Bessire and others moved to Nashville. The Brown County Art Gallery was opened in 1926. In 1954 a larger gallery was built on East Main Street, and an Art Guild established a gallery in the old Minor House on Van Buren Street.

While several major fires destroyed many of Nashville's original buildings, some significant houses, built during the town's formative years remain. With its quaint houses, tree-lined sidewalks and many alleys, Nashville provides an enjoyable walking experience during any of the four seasons.

Brown County State Park

One of Brown County's primary natural as well as historic attractions is the 16,000 acre Brown County State Park. As travelers enter at the north entrance from SR 46 they will pass through the Ramp Creek Covered Bridge of 1838 built by Henry Wolfe. Inside the Park there are a number of historic sites beginning with the North Gate House, the Upper and the Lower Shelter House, the Saddle Barn and the Amphitheater in back of the Abe Martin Lodge. The Lodge, built in 1932 was enlarged and added on several times. It provides rooms for overnight guests, meeting rooms, and a restaurant. Other historic sites inside the Park are the Aynes House, Hesitation Point vistas and Shelter, the West Lookout Tower, the Fire Tower, Hoosier Nest, Ogle Lake and Shelter, Shelter House-County Store, Lake Strahl Shelter and Restrooms, and several additional houses.

Brown County Courthouse Historic District

The Courthouse, Old Log Jail, and the Historical Society Pioneer Village Museum are located in the center of Nashville. The District is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Historic 1874 Brown County Courthouse is located at Nashville's Town Square. On the night of 3 November 1873 the Brown County Court House caught fire and burned. When the Court House was later rebuilt of brick, access to the upper floor was only by the outside iron stairs, on each side of the front door to the door on the second floor over the main entrance.

Pioneer Village Museum

The Pioneer Village is located on the Northeast Corner behind the Brown County Courthouse and across the street from the Brown County History Center. The Old Log Jail is Indiana's only extant hewn-log jail. The two-story building was constructed in 1879, replacing a smaller jail, and continued in use until the 1920s.

The Brown County Community Building like the jail is of hewn-log construction. The two-story building was originally used as a barn in neighboring Jackson County, until it was moved to Nashville's Town Square in 1936. It was used as a community center until the 1960s.

The Village includes a blacksmith shop and Dr. Alfred J. Ralph's office that practiced medicine in Brown County. Operated by the Brown County Historical Society, the Pioneer Village complex displays and recalls Brown County's past in five preserved and restored buildings which allow the visitor to more clearly imagine life as it was lived. Nashville House

Across from the Court House on the corner of Main and S. Van Buren Streets is the Nashville House, famous for its country fare and the Old Country Store. The store provides the atmosphere of an old-fashioned Trading Post. Photographs of famous Brown Countians on the walls look down on the shopper. They were taken by one artist, sometimes chastised for not being an artist at all, was the photographer Frank Hohenberger.

Hobnob Corner Restaurant

Across from the Nashville House, on the opposite corner of W. Main and S. Van Buren Streets is a 2-story white frame building, the former Frank Target Drug Store/Miller's Drug Store, now a popular eatery known as the Hobnob Corner Restaurant. It still captures the old Brown County drug store atmosphere.

Village Green Building

A little down the road from the Hobnob on 61 W. Main Street is the 3-story, red-brick Village Green Building, the former Masonic Lodge and Knights of Phytias Building with many stores, artists' shops and the Ferrer Art Gallery.

Other Nashville Sites

While several major fires destroyed many of Nashville's original buildings, some significant houses, built during the town's formative years, remain. With its quaint houses, tree-lined sidewalks and many alleys, Nashville provides an enjoyable walking experience during any of the four seasons.

The Thomas A. Hendricks House and Stone Head Road Marker

They are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The House and property are located on 4645 E. Bellsville Pike at the juncture of SR 135 and Bellsville Road as one drives to Story.

T.C. Steele Historic Site

The T.C. Steele Site comprises 211 acres with original buildings, furnishings, paintings, partially restored gardens and five hiking trails. Theodore C. Steele and his wife Selma were the first of the artists to actually decide to call Brown County home. They had a house constructed near Belmont Indiana. Now just off State Road 46, it is operated as the T.C. Steele Home State Historic Site. Steele's large studio and home, the House of the Singing Winds, can be visited during most of the year. A quaint village founded in 1851, Story lies nestled in the hills of southern Indiana, a place known for its weather-beaten barns, clapboard churches, covered bridges. The "Story Inn," formerly a turn-of-the-century general store, is open year-round with renovated historic rooms or cottages. The Village of Story is a departure plucked from Steinbeck's "The Grapes of Wrath". CULTURAL HERITAGE ASSETS

For more than 100 years, Brown County has been known as the "Art Colony of the Midwest." Around the turn of the century, attracted by the splendid scenery, by its hills and unspoiled natural beauty, artists began to visit Brown County, Indiana to paint. The artists who first arrived in Brown County --- artists like Adolph and Ada Shulz, Theodore Clement Steele, and Louis Oscar Griffith --- usually spent the summer and early fall and often stayed at the Pittmann Inn in Nashville.

T.C. Steele and his wife Selma were the first of the artists to actually decide to call Brown County home. As they settled in what they called the “Peaceful Valley” they created the Art Colony of the Midwest.

There is still an art colony in Brown County. The highest concentration of Indiana artists call Brown County home, continuing the tradition and vision, established by the numerous artists that came before them. From pottery to glass blowing to painting to woodcarving, art aficionados of all interests will appreciate the eclectic mix of artisans and galleries.

In 1926, eight artists came together to form the Brown County Art Gallery Association. The land on which the gallery stands was given to the association by Adolph Shulz. The Gallery still exists today and has a fantastic permanent collection with exemplary works by most of the early artists. The Gallery also hosts the Glen Cooper Henshaw Collection. At the heart of Brown County, Nashville is home to more than 250 shops, art galleries, and studios. Find “Handmade” around every corner. Visit the Lawrence Family Glass Blowers and shop for unique glass ornaments and gifts. The Village of Nashville isn’t the only place for art though. Many studios and galleries reside on back roads throughout Brown County.
